



Assetto Corsa Rally Time Attack Challenge Official Supplementary Regulations

Presented by The Matrix, 7 Mile Racing in association with the Cayman Motoring Federation

Venue: The Matrix VR Centre

Competition Dates:

Round 1: July 27 – August 8, 2026

Round 2: August 10 – August 22, 2026

1. Event Overview

The Assetto Corsa Rally Time Attack Challenge is a two-round virtual rally competition designed to test precision, consistency and speed over two unique rally stages. Competitors will attempt to set the fastest possible stage time during each round using identical equipment and vehicle specifications. At the conclusion of Round Two, the combined times from both rounds will determine the overall championship standings. The event is open to competitors of all skill levels.

2. Competition Format

- Two independent rally stages.
- One 30-minute competition session per \$25 entry.
- Unlimited attempts within the allotted time.
- Maximum of 2 entries per competitor per round (Better of the times counts)
- Registered competitors have access to unlimited 20-minute practice sessions (\$15 per session)
- Only complete runs are eligible.
- The fastest valid run becomes the competitor's official result for that round.
- Once the session expires, no further attempts are permitted.

3. Entry Fee

KYD \$25 per Round, including a 30-minute exclusive simulator session, unlimited attempts during the session, official timing, and inclusion on the live leaderboard. A second round can be purchased for an additional KYD \$20.

Registered competitors have access to unlimited 20-minute practice sessions for \$15 per session. Times set in practice sessions are **not** eligible for the leaderboard.



4. Eligible Equipment

All competitors will use identical simulator hardware and software. The Organizer will specify the steering wheel, pedals, force feedback, assists, camera view, and other settings. Competitors may not alter these settings unless authorized.

5. Vehicle and Stage Selection

The vehicle and rally location for each round will be announced in advance. The specific stage will remain confidential until the weekend before the round begins.

6. Official Competition Sessions

Official runs may only take place during designated competition periods and must be pre-booked through The Matrix. Late arrivals may have their available session time reduced.

7. Stewarding

Every official session will be supervised by a CMF-appointed Steward responsible for verifying competitor identity, recording times, monitoring compliance, and certifying official results.

8. Timing

Official timing will be based on the in-game Assetto Corsa stage completion time. Only completed runs are valid. The fastest completed run during the session is the official result.

9. Restarts

Competitors may restart as many times as desired within the 30-minute session. The session clock continues to run during restarts.

10. Leaderboard

An official leaderboard will be maintained and may be displayed at The Matrix and on event social media channels.

11. Championship Scoring

Overall standings will be determined by combining each competitor's fastest official time from Round One and Round Two. The lowest combined time wins.

12. Tie Break

Ties will be broken by: (1) Fastest Round Two time; (2) Fastest individual stage; (3) Fewest restart attempts; (4) Steward decision.

13. Driver Conduct

Competitors are expected to display good sportsmanship. Unsporting behaviour, abuse of equipment, or interference with officials may result in penalties or disqualification.



14. Technical Regulations

Factory default vehicle setup only. No tuning or setup changes. Manual or automatic transmission permitted unless otherwise specified by the Organizer.

15. Replay Review

The Organizer reserves the right to review replays to investigate exploits, wall-riding, track limit abuse, or other unfair advantages.

16. Technical Failures

Should equipment fail during an official session, the Steward may restart, extend, or reschedule the session as appropriate.

17. Awards

Suggested awards include: Overall Champion, 2nd and 3rd Overall, Fastest Female Driver, Fastest Junior Driver, Best First-Time Competitor, and Most Improved Driver.

18. Protests

Protests must be submitted in writing before the close of the applicable competition round. The Steward and Organizer's decision is final.

19. Organizer Rights

The Organizer reserves the right to amend these regulations, alter schedules, replace stages if required, and remove competitors for misconduct.

20. Event Sponsor

Sponsorship of the event is provided by the Cayman Motoring Federation, an FIA approved federation.
